EvaSys Module Questionnaire - levels of permission

- Reports were issued for undergraduate modules completed during a particular semester
- All lecturing staff, specified as the primary lecturer for a given module and whose email address was provided by their DMIS administrators received a report
- Following University policy, a copy of the report was also distributed academic line managers.
- In the case of a Head of an academic unit, a copy of the report was sent to their academic line manager e.g. head of college.
- If there was more than one lecturer teaching the module in question, this lecturer or lecturers should receive a copy of the report from their colleague designated by the unit as the primary lecturer or head of unit.
- The purpose of the survey is to provide a systematic evaluation by students of their learning experiences at UCC. Under University policy, the role of academic heads in the student feedback process will be to review the results of student surveys and, if necessary, to discuss with individual staff improvements in module content, teaching, learning, and assessment practice. It should be emphasised that the results of student surveys of particular modules are to be confidential to individual members of staff and the Head of their academic unit.
